

Tibberton Parish Council

The issues caused by recent flooding was a key topic of the Parish Council ZOOM meeting held on the 13th January 2021. Council supported a proposed flooding assessment report on issues created by long term and recent landowner developments and maintenance. Villagers were thanked for their support of neighbours and the contributions of others in their efforts to ease the impact of the recent flooding in the village.

Planning issues and the finalised response objecting to the local plan to 'dump' a large town at Churcham were discussed and actioned.

Gloucestershire Highways have now resurfaced and added kerbs to the road from the Forge along Buttermilk Lane. Council agreed this will benefit pedestrians and afford more room for vehicles to pass.

Vehicle Activated Sign group reported on their progress to address inappropriate vehicle speed through the village. This will involve the purchase of a sign and a group of people to manage. 50% of the costs can be claimed from other sources however, costs of approximately £1500 will need to be accommodated in future Parish Council budget plans.
